Writers who

- meet deadlines,
- follow submission guidelines and
- submit to the editing process

will be chosen for inclusion in a book titled **And Then There Was Light**, published by Living Parables, an imprint of EABooks Publishing. Authors will be able to purchase books at a reduced rate and keep the profit from their sales.

GUIDELINES

- Authors (can have articles, blogs, or online content published either paid or unpaid, but not a book for which royalties were paid)
- Only those who follow the full submission guidelines will be considered
- One submission per person registered for the conference
- Can submit a short story, article, devotional, poem, or prayer
- 1500-word limit
- Include a 50-word bio at the end of your submission written in 3rd person, a title to your piece, and your name with contact information (email, address, and phone number) at the top of the first page of the submission (none of this is included in submission word count total)

- Standard manuscript format (Times New Roman, 12pt font, double-spaced, 1-inch margins, Microsoft Word doc or docx)
- The submission should tie-in to the theme of the book (description at end of this email).
- Submissions must be submitted via email attachment to **contests@eabookspublishing.com** by **midnight March 20, 2021** and **include CCWC in the subject line.**

Those that best reflect the theme, who meet submission guidelines and represent the best writing of a new author, will be chosen for inclusion in the book. Participants will be announced in the Carolina Christian Writers Conference newsletter on Saturday, March 27, 2021 and they will receive email confirmation from EABooks Publishing.
